**Harrison County Levy for Funds to Continue Public Bus Transportation**

Special election to authorize additional levies, allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount, for the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2017, July 1, 2018, July 1, 2019, July 1, 2020, and July 1, 2021, for the purpose of providing for the continued operation of the mass transportation bus system in Harrison County, West Virginia, according to the Order of the Harrison County Commission, adopted on the 21st day of January, 2016. The funds raised will be used for general operating expenses, including matching funds to obtain federal funds for replacement of existing bus inventory, and other improvements to garage facilities.

The additional levy allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, shall be on Class I property 1.84 cents; on Class II property 3.68 cents; and on Class III and Class IV property 7.36 cents; per \$100.00 valuation.

The additional levy allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, shall be on Class I property 1.94 cents; on Class II property 3.88 cents; and on Class III and Class IV property 7.76 cents; per \$100.00 valuation.

The additional levy allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, shall be on Class I property 2.03 cents; on Class II property 4.06 cents; and on Class III and Class IV property 8.12 cents; per \$100.00 valuation.

The additional levy allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, shall be on Class I property 2.13 cents; on Class II property 4.26 cents; and on Class III and Class IV property 8.52 cents; per \$100.00 valuation.

The additional levy allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, shall be on Class I property 2.24 cents; on Class II property 4.48 cents; and on Class III and Class IV property 8.96 cents; per \$100.00 valuation.

That in the event the separate and aggregate assessed valuation of each class of taxable property within the County of Harrison increases during the term of the special levy, the levy rate shall be adjusted so that the projected tax collection will not exceed the maximum sum of: \$2,261,951 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017; \$2,384,882 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018; \$2,495,522 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019; \$2,618,453 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020; and \$2,753,678 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021.

In the event any of these entities or agencies would cease to exist, for whatever reason, the funding allocated to said entity or agency may be utilized by the Harrison County Parks and Recreation Department for program operations and/or by the Harrison County Commission for capital improvement projects at county owned facilities covered by this levy order.

According to the Order of the Harrison County Commission, adopted on the 21st day of January, 2016. The funds raised will be used for providing adequate funding to operate the aforesaid organizations.

The additional levy, allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017, shall be on Class I property 3.02 cents; and on Class II property 6.04 cents; and on Class III and Class IV property 12.08 cents; per \$100.00 valuation.

The additional levy, allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018, shall be on Class I property 3.17 cents; and on Class II property 6.34 cents; and on Class III and Class IV property 12.68 cents; per \$100.00 valuation.

The additional levy, allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, shall be on Class I property 3.33 cents; and on Class II property 6.66 cents; and on Class III and Class IV property 13.32 cents; per \$100.00 valuation.

The additional levy, allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020, shall be on Class I property 3.50 cents; and on Class II property 7.00 cents; and on Class III and Class IV property 14.00 cents; per \$100.00 valuation.

The additional levy, allowing for 5% delinquencies and 2% discount, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021, shall be on Class I property 3.67 cents; and on Class II property 7.34 cents; and on Class III and Class IV property 14.68 cents; per \$100.00 valuation.

That in the event the separate and aggregate assessed valuation of each class of taxable property within the County of Harrison increases during the term of the special levy, the levy rate shall be adjusted so that the projected tax collection will be a maximum of \$3,712,550 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2017; a maximum of \$3,896,946 for fiscal year beginning July 1, 2018; a maximum of \$4,093,639 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019; a maximum of \$4,302,623 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020; and a maximum of \$4,511,608 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021.
